**MAGISTRATE'S COMPLAINT**

The Attorney General of Guam hereby accuses **JOAQUIN VILLAGOMEZ CANGO** and **SCOTT QUICHOCHO SANTOS** of certain crimes committed as follows:

**FIRST CHARGE**

On or about the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2020, in Guam, **JOAQUIN VILLAGOMEZ CANGO**, did commit the offense of *Third Degree Robbery (As a Third Degree Felony)*, in that he did

1 intentionally and unlawfully use force against *Nishide Soari and Asuka Taru*, with the intent to  
2 overcome the physical resistance or physical power of resistance of *Nishide Soari and Asuka Taru*  
3 while in the course of committing theft, in violation of 9 GCA §§ 40.30(a)(1) and (b), and 80.30.

5 **SECOND CHARGE**

6 On or about the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2020, in Guam, **SCOTT QUICHOCHO SANTOS**, did  
7 commit the offense of *Third Degree Robbery (As a Third Degree Felony)*, his guilt established by  
8 complicity, in that he, with the intention of promoting or assisting in the commission of *Third*  
9 *Degree Robbery (As a Third Degree Felony)*, did induce or aid another person, *to wit: JOAQUIN*  
10 **VILLAGOMEZ CANGO** to unlawfully use force against *Nishide Soari and Asuka Taru*, with the  
11 intent to overcome the physical resistance or physical power of resistance of *Nishide Soari and*  
12 *Asuka Taru* while in the course of committing theft, in violation of 9 GCA §§ 40.30(a)(1) and (b),  
13 4.60 and 80.30.

**DECLARATION**

COMES NOW, LEONARDO M. RAPADAS, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, aver upon information and belief that the following declaration is true. I have reviewed Guam Police Report 20-01161 submitted by Guam Police Department ("GPD") Officers D. Calvo, M. Oliva and others that indicated the following occurred in Guam:

On or about January 12, 2020, at about 12:37 a.m., officers responded to a robbery along Pale San Vitores Road between Island Breeze Massage and the Fiesta Resort Hotel in Tumon. Officers spoke to Sara R. Brookshier ("Reporting Person") who told them that while walking on the sidewalk by the hotel, she heard a female screaming further up ahead from her. She saw two (2) females and a male struggling by Island Breeze. The three (3) fell to the pavement. The male stood up and pulled what appeared to be a purse from one (1) of the females and ran into the alley next to Island Breeze. He was described as wearing a light colored shirt and dark shorts. A blue vehicle passed her and turned into the alley. Soon afterwards, a red Ford Edge, license plate no. MT 2610 ("Suspect Vehicle"), exited the alley and sped away. Witnesses were interviewed and told the officers they had seen the male getting off the ground with the purse. Realizing it was a robbery in progress, they followed the male into the alley with their blue vehicle. They had to pull to the side to avoid a collision when they saw the above described vehicle heading towards them.

The two (2) female victims were identified as **Nishide Soari** and **Asuka Taru, Victims 1** and **2**, respectively, and were guests of the Fiesta Hotel. They told officers that as they were walking back from K-Mart to their hotel, a male grabbed Victim 1's purse. She held on to it tightly. Victim 2 attempted to assist Victim 1 by holding on to the purse also. As they struggled, they ended up on the road. The male then yanked the purse very hard causing all three (3) to fall. The male quickly got up, pulled the purse one (1) more time and broke the strap. He ran away. Victim 1 suffered swelling to the back of her head and scrapes to her right elbow and both knees. Victim 2 suffered scrapes to her right elbow and both knees, and pain to her lower back area. Victim 1's property was identified to be brown, weave pattern, leather purse with black straps containing two (2) wallets containing various Japanese and U.S. currency, Japanese passport, a MiFi device, and other miscellaneous items.


At about 1:25 a.m., same date, after an all point bulletin was released, the Suspect Vehicle was located at a Lada Avenue, Dededo residence. The passenger was identified as, **JOAQUIN VILLAGOMEZ CANGO ("DEFENDANT 1")**, while the driver was identified as **SCOTT QUICHOCHO SANTOS ("DEFENDANT 2")**. **DEFENDANT 2** was interviewed and admitted to driving **DEFENDANT 1** and himself to and from the robbery. He also admitted to driving **DEFENDANT 1** around as he tossed stolen items out the vehicle window. The officers were able to recover much of the evidence.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **JOAQUIN VILLAGOMEZ CANGO** with **THIRD DEGREE ROBBERY (As a Third Degree Felony)**, in violation of 9 GCA §§ 40.30(a)(1) and (b).

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **SCOTT QUICHOCHO SANTOS** with **THIRD DEGREE ROBBERY (As a Third Degree Felony)**, in violation of 9 GCA §§ 40.30(a)(1), (b), and 4.60.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
