MAGISTRATE'S COMPLAINT

The Attorney General of Guam hereby accuses **FAYE MARIE KANG** of certain crimes committed as follows:

On or about the 5th day of February, 2020, in Guam, **FAYE MARIE KANG**, did commit the offense of *Terroristic Conduct (As a 3rd Degree Felony)*, in that she did knowingly threaten to commit a crime of violence with the intent to cause evacuation of a building, that is, *Astumbo Elementary School*, or she recklessly disregarded the risk of causing such inconvenience, in violation of 9 GCA §§ 19.50(a) and (b).

Special Allegation

Crime Against the Community

It is further alleged that in the commission of the above offense, the Defendant, **FAYE MARIE KANG**, did commit the offense of *Crime Against the Community*, in that she knowingly took action resulting in a deprivation of public

services, such as the education of public or private school students, or any government service intended to benefit the public, in violation of 9 GCA § 43.31.

DECLARATION

COMES NOW, Rolland B. Wimberley, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, and aver, upon information and belief, that the foregoing is true. I have reviewed Guam Police Report No. 20-03688 submitted by Guam Police Department Officers E.K. Pewtress that sets forth the following events occurred on Guam:

On or about February 5, 2020 at around 10:24 A.M., GPD Officers received reports from a Department of Education employee that a female individual had made a call and threatened to go to the school and shoot people.


When police arrived at the school gates, which was in lock down, they were granted access to the main office. Officers met with Tia Salas (reporting person) who stated that she had received a call from **Faye Marie Kang** (Defendant), who had threatened to shoot Chuukese kids who had threatened her grandson. The Defendant had called and stated that her grandson was being bullied, that she had complained and that nothing was being done. She told Ms. Salas that, "If anything happens to my grandson, I will go to the school and shoot each and every one of them who hurts my grandson." Ms. Salas informed her superiors at the school.

Officers met with the Defendant and advised her of her Miranda rights, which she waived by signing. The Defendant stated that she was dissatisfied with GDOE's handling of her granddaughter and grandson being bullied at their schools. The Defendant stated that during her venting, she did not threaten anyone. However, she did admit that in the heat of the moment, she speaks fast and sometimes says things she does not mean. She did recall saying "shooting" but did not remember how she said it.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **Faye Marie Kang** with:

1. **Terroristic Conduct (As a Third Degree Felony)**, in violation of Title 9 GCA §§ 19.50(a) and (b)
 - a. **Special Allegation: Crime Against the Community**, in violation of Title 9 GCA §§ 43.31

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
